

MoDEX Project Update

Effective March 11, 2010, the Missouri Data Exchange (MoDEX) Project Manager, Mrs. Carolyn Kampeter, resigned to pursue work with juveniles, an area in which she has held a long interest. We wish her the best of luck in her endeavors. Beginning April 16, 2010, Laurie Crawford, formerly a Senior CJIS Manager at the Missouri State Highway Patrol, assumed the duties as Project Manager.

Project priorities will continue to be 1) successful interface to the various agencies waiting for system connectivity, 2) bringing additional agencies on board, and 3) launching a secure ISP. If any agency has been experiencing difficulty in establishing connectivity (either via interface to share information or via user access), please contact Laurie at 573-526-4697 or by email at Laurie.Crawford@dps.mo.gov.

Testing of submissions from MoDEX to N-DEX (the National Data Exchange) continues. There are few issues remaining to be resolved. We anticipate MoDEX data being available within N-DEX very soon.

There is now a calendar of events available in the MoDEX Special Interest Group (SIG) on Law Enforcement Online (LEO). For LEO system access, please go to www.leo.gov and submit a request for access form to the CJIS Division of the Missouri State Highway Patrol (address is on the last page of this newsletter). Once the form is signed by the CSO, Major Bob Bloomberg, it will be forwarded to the FBI CJIS Division for your account to be established. Once your account is established and you have logged in to LEO, go to the Public SIGs and you will see MoDEX listed. Open the MoDEX SIG, and you can access forms, documents, contact information, and the event calendar.

Fingerprint Processing Changes due to 2010 Census Employees

In order for the FBI CJIS Division to process all of the applicant fingerprint submissions for the 484,000 temporary Census Bureau employees, the Missouri State Highway Patrol has been asked to refrain from submitting any non-criminal fingerprints to the FBI during the week of April 28 - May 3,



2010. The MSHP will submit any non-criminal fingerprint submission received during that week on May 4, 2010. While the FBI does not anticipate any delay on criminal fingerprint responses, the non-criminal responses may be delayed up to two weeks until the national backlog is complete.

Employee Background Checks prohibited through the Mo-DEx System

The Missouri Data Exchange (Mo-DEx) system is a statewide data warehouse developed to provide information sharing to Missouri law enforcement agencies to combat terrorism and crime. Personnel having access to Mo-DEx are subject to fingerprint background checks conducted through the MSHP prior to system access. Background check results should be kept at the local agency level for audit purposes. The Mo-DEx system is not in any manner intended to be an official repository of original records or to be used as a substitute for one. Information in the system, including any analytical products, may be disseminated subject to the following requirements:

- Hard or electronic copies of documents retrieved from the system may not be provided to a participating or nonparticipating agency without the approval of the contributing agency.
- Information or summaries of information from the system may be shared with a non-participating law enforcement agency in the furtherance of a legitimate law enforcement investigation or for development of community crime analysis.
- Immediate dissemination of information can be made if the recipient of the information determines that an emergency involving an actual or potential threat of terrorism, immediate danger of death or serious physical injury to any person, or imminent harm to national security require dissemination without delay. The owner of the information shall be promptly notified of all disseminations made under this exception.

Failure to comply with these requirements could result in civil and/or criminal penalties. 576.050 RSMo states that misuse of official information is a criminal act punishable as a Class A misdemeanor.



New MULES presentation shown at the 2009 MONENA Convention

The MULES training unit was on hand to debut screen shots from the new MULES system that is being worked on by CPI using the Open Fox platform. Around 60 convention attendees sat in the presentation which was hosted by Shannon Peirce and Christina Lashmet from the MULES Training Division. The four hour presentation went over screen shots of the upcoming system, system requirements, and how training will be handled. Please note that the handout given during this presentation is available on the CJIS launch pad in the CPI folder. If you have questions regarding the new system, please contact your local MULES Trainer.

QIMP/ QEMP Purpose Code 3 Transactions

Each time a QIMP/QEMP Purpose Code 3 inquiry is made, it automatically generates a \$10.00 charge to the inquiring agency's ORI. This includes when duplicate inquiries are made of the same individual or if the operator attempts a TEST inquiry.

Please remind your operators to use the QIMP/QEMP transaction only for non-criminal justice city or county governmental employment. This is not a replacement inquiry for volunteer positions or other positions that require fingerprint submissions. QIMP/QEMP should not be used if a city or county department is contracting an "off the street" company for any type of various job duty. It is also not to be run with any other transactions, QW, QWR QIDE, etc.

Due to the \$10.00 fee and access to only Missouri open records, the QIMP/QEMP should not be used for hiring or for periodic review of criminal justice employees. If you are hiring criminal justice personnel or completing the required on-line criminal history inquiry for criminal justice personnel, you should be running the QW, QWR, QIDE, QIDI, QH, etc. transactions using Purpose Code J. There is no cost to the agency and you receive all criminal history you need, not just Missouri open record.

This reminder is to help cut down on your agency's costs and to slow down the on-line searches that take place every month to determine which operator on what terminal conducted the QIMP Purpose Code 3 after an agency receives the bill for an inquiry that was not needed. The billing for the QIMP transactions is mailed out on the 7th of the month following the transactions and is payable upon receipt. Please remind your accounts payable department to submit their payments.

New Policy regarding MULES Operator Access at all Missouri 911/Communications Centers

Current MULES policy requires that all potential MULES operators with a criminal record of any kind request permission prior to receiving access to the confidential information contained in the system. If the hiring agency would still like to employ this individual as a MULES Operator, an Operator Request Letter is required to be drafted by the Terminal Agency Administrator (TAA) of the hiring agency and mailed to the Missouri State CJIS Systems Officer (Major Robert Bloomberg of the MSHP). This letter provides language that the hiring agency is aware of the arrest history and will take responsibility for that operator's MULES transactions. Major Bloomberg then reviews each request on a case-by-case basis and responds with his decision via letter. A sample of an acceptable Operator Request Letter is available in the Terminal Agency Coordinator section of the CJIS Launchpad.

While this policy applies to all MULES Terminal Agencies statewide, the MSHP Access Integrity

Unit has added another level of review for all operators employed by a 911 Center. Pursuant to the *Management Control Agreement* executed by all 911 Centers in conjunction with a law enforcement agency or board located within their political subdivision or county (Sheriff's Office or Police Department), the Chief Law Enforcement Officer (CLEO) of the associated law enforcement agency should also be involved in the decisions on individual operator access to the CJIS/MULES network.

Effective January 1, 2010, all Operator Request Letters on 911 Operators must have the signature of BOTH the 911 Center TAA and the CLEO (Sheriff or Chief) of the associated law enforcement agency.

Please note that if the MSHP discovers (through a MULES Policy Compliance Review or by any other means) that an active operator has a criminal record of any kind that has not been previously disclosed within an Operator Request Letter

to the State CJIS Systems Officer, the TAA and CLEO will have thirty (30) days to submit a joint letter requesting the operator be permitted to access the MULES system. If we do not receive this letter within thirty (30) days, or only receive a signature from one of the required parties, MULES access will be terminated for each operator in question. Pursuant to the CJIS Security Policy, the discovery of any felony conviction or felony arrest pending disposition will result in the immediate termination of the operator's MULES access and the thirty (30) day timeframe does not apply.

Due to the sensitive nature of the information available through the MULES network, we ask that all applicable Sheriffs, Chiefs, and 911 Center Terminal Agency Administrators please work together to make thorough employment decisions. Missouri Concealed Carry Weapon (CCW) Reciprocity

The Missouri Concealed Carry Law (RSMo 571.101 - 571.121) allows any Missouri resident that is at least 23 years old and has successfully completed a qualified firearms safety course to apply for a Concealed Carry Weapon (CCW) Endorsement from their local sheriff's office. The applicant must also pay the prescribed fee and be fingerprinted by the sheriff's office. These fingerprints will be used to complete a full criminal background check by the Missouri State Highway Patrol (MSHP) and Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in order to search for any disqualifying arrests, convictions, pleas, or other personal information.

If the CCW application is approved, the sheriff must report a Concealed Carry Certificate of Qualification to the Missouri Uniform Law Enforcement System (MULES). The applicant then has seven (7) days to present the Certificate of Qualification to a Missouri Department of Revenue (DOR) driver's license bureau to receive a duplicate driver's license or state identification card showing the CCW endorsement. The CCW endorsement is valid for three (3) years and must be renewed through the local sheriff's department.

A Missouri CCW endorsement is also recognized in the following 36 states:

***Please note that while Missouri recognizes ANY Out-of-State (OOS) CCW Endorsement as valid, the specific CCW laws of Missouri always apply while the holder is within this jurisdiction.

Commendation for NCIC Audit

NCIC conducted their triennial audit of the state of Missouri during August 10 - 14, 2009. During the audit, compliance areas reviewed included operator training, ORI usage, criminal history transactions, hit procedures, and person entries. Audits are an efficient means of ensuring accuracy of entries and indicating misuse of the computer system. The FBI selects a random sampling of agencies with access to NCIC and these agencies represent the state as a whole. Warren County Sheriff's Office, Joplin Police Department, and Newton County Sheriff's Office were the three MULES agencies picked to be audited by the FBI.

The release of the NCIC audit draft showed excellent results. It should be noted that all three agencies were in compliance for record packing and there was no indication of misuse of criminal histories. Two agencies were in compliance on all areas of the audit: Warren County Sheriff's Office and Newton County Sheriff's Office. The 2009 audit results compared to the previous 2006 audit greatly improved and these MULES agencies are commended for their hard work and dedication.

MIBRS Web RMS Pilot Scheduled To Begin

For any agencies currently on the secure MULES Network, the Missouri Incident Based Reporting System (MIBRS) Web based Record Management System (RMS) will be available for Pilot on April 30, 2010. The Pilot is scheduled to last approximately six to twelve weeks, depending on any issues identified with the system. The RMS meets all MIBRS system requirements, and will eventually interface to the Missouri Data Exchange (MoDEX). The CJIS Division of the Missouri State Highway Patrol will provide system support and training. The MIBRS RMS is a web hosted system, available at no cost to those agencies that cannot otherwise afford an electronic RMS.

The CJIS Division is exploring ways by which the system can be deployed in a secure ISP environment. While we are assured that a secure internet option will be available around July 2011, other temporary options are being explored to make this system available before summer 2010 if at all possible. UCR Classification

Homicide

Two felons are fleeing police in a stolen vehicle. They crash. The driver is killed, and the passenger is captured, arrested, and charged with the death of the other offender. This should be reported as a Homicide only if the investigation determines that he intentionally tried to kill his friend.

Failure to Return Property

Fraud - The intentional perversion of the truth for the purpose of inducing another person or other entity in reliance upon it to part with something of value or to surrender a legal right.

Example - An automobile is rented for a period of time but is not returned.

This is classified as Fraud and NOT Motor Vehicle Theft. In such cases, the offender originally had lawful possession of the property (the property was either rented, loaned, or the person was in some way entrusted with its possession) and through deceit (they promised to return it) kept the property.

Therefore, the only reportable offense for the monthly UCR Report would be an arrest for Fraud if/when an arrest is made. No dollar values are reported for Fraud offenses in UCR summary reporting as Fraud is a Part II offense and only arrest data is collected.

Liquor Law Violations

Any violation of any state or local liquor laws, including licensing that the police arrest or issue a summons for, should be reported in the Liquor Laws arrest category.

Trafficking Stolen Identities

Example - If a person is in possession of identifying information on other people that was stolen (either by this person on a previous occasion, or by someone else connected to this person), and the object is to sell the identifying information, they are charged with the offense of Trafficking in Stolen Identities.

This offense could be coded as either a "Stolen Property: Buying, Receiving, Possessing", "Forgery and Counterfeiting", or "All Other Offense". This offense should be handled much like the Tampering offenses...since it is a one to many relationship, the one charge could be mapped to many different statistical offenses.

For general coding, agencies should use "Forgery and Counterfeiting", with the understanding that it won't be correct all of the time and the agency still has an obligation to review the narrative and possibly correct or change the NIBRS/UCR code.

The Missouri UCR Program began MIBRS certification of agencies on February 1, 2006. There are several points to remember regarding MIBRS Certification:

- The transition to incident-based reporting is voluntary, not mandatory.
- Any agency choosing to convert from summary UCR reporting to incident-based reporting must first be certified to ensure the quality of their crime data.
- During the certification process, agencies will be required to submit summary UCR reports.
- Once certified by the state program, summary UCR reporting will no longer be required as the incident-based data received from that agency will be converted to summary by the state.
- Repository specifications for the submission files are available upon request or can be accessed via the UCR website "Downloads" link.
